## THE MATCHUP



STUNG THE RAYS — Tuesday night's game in North Charleston marked the first time the Swamp Rabbits beat the South Carolina Stingrays this year, handing the Rays just their first home loss and their second loss overall this season. After Greenville got on the board first, something South Carolina had done in 10 of their first 12 games, the Rabbits scored again in the second on an Adam Larkin strike that came on the heels of a power play. The Rays battled back in the second period and tied the game at two after 40 minutes. It looked as though the momentum was completely on South Carolina's side until they had their potential third goal of the game called off, when the officials ruled that it was kicked in. The Swamp Rabbits responded with haste, lighting the lamp twice off the stick of Patrick Bajkov. Jeremy Helvig was stellar, reeling in a career-high 48 saves in a signature early-season triumph.

CONTROLLING THE ICE — The Swamp Rabbits have faced off against the Icemen three times this year and have won each game so far. Greenville has outscored Jacksonville 15-7 over that span. The last time the Rabbits saw the Icemen was just under three weeks ago in a high-scoring affair. Matt Marcinew scored two of Greenville's five goals on the night and the Bunnies hopped away with what was then their only win since October 30th. Ryan Bednard stopped 25 of the 28 shots he faced en route to the victory. Since their last meeting with Swamp Rabbits, Jacksonville is 2-3.

ANOTHER TOUGH TEST IN GOAL — The 'Bits will face another brick wall in net tonight in the form of Michael McNiven. In five games this season, McNiven is 3-2 with a 1.81 goals against average. His 0.942 save percentage is second-best among qualified goalies over five games, four of which came in an Adirondack Thunder uniform. McNiven has pitched two shutouts in the early going and was nearly as good in his Jacksonville debut last week. The Icemen couldn't score any goals for McNiven, who stopped 34 of the 36 shots that came his way in a 3-0 loss against the Orlando Solar Bears last Saturday. The 22-year-old played 30 games with the AHL's Laval Rocket last season and posted a 2.52 GAA and turned aside 90.2% of opposing shots.

THE PECARARO EFFECT — Greenville received Liam Pecararo back from his stint with the Springfield Thunderbirds before Tuesday's game, and the talented forward has already started making a difference at the ECHL level. Pecararo drew a key slashing minor in the third period against South Carolina, leading to one of his two assists on the night. Before being recalled by Springfield, Pecararo was a constant at the top of the ECHL points board. His 10 goals are still tied for first among all qualifying rookies, and the mark ties him for second in goals around the league.

BAJKOV BURNING — Patrick Bajkov has been so hot that not even the sheets of ice beneath him have been able to cool him down. In his second professional season, Bajkov has already amassed a career high in points with 17 on 11 goals and 6 assists in nearly half as many games (17) as he played in the ECHL last year (31). Those 11 goals are second-most among qualified ECHL skaters, and his sterling 34.4% shooting percentage is third-best in the league.
